Why this ongoing reform?

A fact: the importance of non-take-up

A commitment by President Macron in his electoral campaign: "automation of the payment of benefits"

Hence the ongoing reform: "at-source solidarity"



The main problems that need addressing:

One application for each type of benefit


Different means are taken into account depending on the benefit Recipients have to regularly declare their means (except for housing allowances)

Simplification

- 1. Harmonisation of the means taken into account
- Better reliability of the data (means) and automation of their acquisition
- 3. Pre-filled out declaration of means
- 4. Targeted incentives for potential recipients to apply


